### **Renewal of Baptismal Promises**

The feast of the Baptism of our Lord is one of a number of days when the renewal of baptismal promises can occur. Considering the past year this has been and our longing once more to be witnesses to the grace and miracle of new birth, it would be fully appropriate for enter into the renewal of our own baptismal promises.
