Blessing of the Easter Water

Priest: Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All: who keeps his promise for ever.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Priest: We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.
Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.
Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John

and was anointed by the Holy Spirit
as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us
from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.
In it we are buried with Christ in his death.
By it we share in his resurrection.
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,
we celebrate our fellowship in him in faith.
We pray that all who have passed
through the water of baptism
may continue for ever in the risen life
of Jesus Christ our Saviour.
Renewed in your image,
may they walk by the light of faith
and continue for ever
in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit
be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

Priest: Concerning all of God's creation,
All: With God's help, I will strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth.

Priest: Almighty God,
in our baptisms you have consecrated us
to be temples of your Holy Spirit.
May we, whom you have counted worthy and
reconciled to you, nurture this gift of your indwelling
Spirit with a lively faith and worship you with upright
lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
All: Amen.

Priest: I invite you at home to this time to take your bowl of
water, dip your finger in the water, and make the sign
of the cross, if you wish, on your forehead with water.
