

Welcome and Introduction (The Rev. Daniel Fournier)

We pray for communities challenged by forces beyond their control—natural disaster, political strife and the economic consequences of the pandemic. Give courage to those facing challenges, and wisdom to those who lead, so that well-being may be restored soon and hope for the future prevail. Risen Christ.
