**Welcome to David Palmer – We welcome David Palmer to the organ bench this evening. Susanne is taking a well-deserved leave of absence this month and into the new year. David Palmer was born in Victoria and received his early musical education at Christ Church Cathedral, first as a boy chorister, later as Assistant Organist. After serving as Organist at St. Paul's Naval and Garrison Church (now Sts Peter and Paul Church), he pursued music degrees at the University of Michigan where he studied with Robert Glasgow. Moving to Windsor, Ontario, in 1968, he became Organist and Choirmaster at All

Saints' Anglican Church there, and in 1970, began his 40-year tenure as a Professor in the School of Music at the University of Windsor. David performed from coast to coast in Canada, and in several centres in the U.S., as well as at the cathedrals of Chartres and Notre Dame of Paris. A soloist several times with the Windsor Symphony Orchestra, he recorded many programs for CBC-Radio and on CD. David and his wife, Lonnie, are excited to be back in Victoria, enjoying time with family and looking forward to renewing old friendships and making new ones.
