

Priest: Praise God who made heaven and earth,

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Priest: We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water

to sustain, refresh, and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us renew the promises we made in baptism.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Priest: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Priest: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the

prayers?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever

you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you proclaim by word and example the good

news of God in Christ?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving

your neighbour as yourself?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you strive for justice and peace

among all people,

and respect the dignity of every human being?

All: I will, with God's help.

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Priest: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity

of God's creation and respect, sustain,

and renew the life of the earth?

All: I will, with God's help.

The Peace: (Please stand as you are able.)

For the peace, please acknowledge your greeting of peace

by a simple bow – with no physical contact.

Priest: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

Note that the offerings will be taken forward to the altar during this hymn, but we aren't allowed to pass around the collection plate at this time. If you missed putting in your donation as you entered the church, donations left in the collection plates after the service will also be collected.

- **Celebrate Easter Service TODAY at 2:30 pm. This will be a short, in-person child-friendly service, followed by an Easter Egg hunt.
- **The New Sanctuary Bells, which were blessed during the Maundy Thursday service, are given to the glory of God and in loving memory of St. Luke's Altar-Servers and Liturgical Assistants, past and present.
- *8 am In-Person Services are Back Said 8 am Sunday services will resume starting on Easter Sunday and then from May 8th going forward for a trial period. We hope to be able to welcome back some of our regular 8 am attendees who haven't been able to attend the 10 am

services. Note that there will not be an 8 am service on April 24th or May 1st.

***COVID-19 Update from the Diocesan COVID-19 Task
Force – All capacity restrictions are now lifted. At this time,
St. Luke's has chosen to continue to offer bread only at
communion. While the mandate to wear masks indoors has
been lifted by the Public Health Office, the Diocesan COVID19 Task Force recommends that parishes continue the
practice of wearing masks during church worship services.
This is based on demographics of our congregations, singing
together (including choirs), limited ventilation, and physical
space. The Diocesan commitment is to support each other in
ensuring a safe environment during this time for all to
participate as much as possible.
