All: Embrace us with your love.

We remember before you today people of different creeds and faiths, those who seek understanding and co-operation among different religious traditions, and those who show love to their neighbours, whatever their creed or conviction...

silence is held...

God, speak to us a word of reconciliation.

All: Embrace us with your love.

We remember before you today your whole creation and its many vulnerable facets and faces. Teach us how to care for the rips and tears in the fabric of the world you love so we may live together wisely and protect the future in our attitudes and actions ...

silence is held...

God, speak to us a word of wisdom

All: Embrace us with your love.

And so, in unity with your Church around the world you love, we pray together in Christ's name.
