Invitation to Confession

Priest: Sisters and Brothers,

today's Gospel challenges the depth

of our relationship to Christ,

who calls himself the vine and us, the branches. The immediacy of this relationship was palpable among the early Christians. But what is it for us? We've been invited into something far deeper and more intimate than any other relationship in our lives.

How comfortable are we with this invitation? God knows us completely and we come to God as one from whom no secrets are hidden, to ask for his forgiveness and peace.

Some Work Completed Recently in the Cemetery – For a number of years, we have wanted steps by the shed to provide easier access to the graves in the upper terrace area (Rows M and N).
