God of healing and hope, we pray for those who know sickness or pain, for all who live in grief, loneliness or anxiety, and all who find these uncertain times overwhelming in any way. In silence, we remember before you those for whom we have special concern this day:

and shared our human nature.
With loving arms outstretched upon the cross for us,

By the resurrection your will was fulfilled
and you gathered a holy people to offer you praise.
Now with all creation we raise our voices
to proclaim your glory, as we sing:
