Invitation to Confession

Priest: Figuring out how to live in faith can sometimes create a confusion of copious rules, regulations, practices and prohibitions.

The reality, however, is a rather simple "heart and soul" thing.

Loving and responding to God cannot happen apart from loving one's neighbour with deep compassion. Today's Gospel reminds us that the neighbour might not be the one we would choose to love. The good Samaritan story is a cautionary tale that catches our attention for good reason.

Being mindful of our neighbour, let us confess our sins to God, who forgives us in Christ.

The Canadian Lutheran Anglican Youth (CLAY) Gathering is a program of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC) and the Anglican Church in Canada bringing together youth ages 14-19 years old and their leaders for programming related to a theme. This year's gathering will be Saskatoon from August 21st – 24th.

The theme of this year's CLAY Gathering is "Rooted and Rising". From our roots laid down for us, from our past, to rising up and putting our best foot forward, and standing up for what we believe in.
